- Greater consistency between each home will mean your children feel more secure.
- By being consistent with your approach to discipline, you create a routine and rhythm for your kids to settle into and also model the importance of respectful relationships and working together.
- When planning, create clear and consistent rules that are utilised in both households and communicate with your parenting partner on their effectiveness.
- Consistency across things like bedtime, screen time, playtime, dinnertime and other after school or before school routines will help the children understand what's expected of them.
- Consider how discipline will be enforced, what tactics do you and your parenting partner both agree on when there is a problem, or when your child makes an error in judgement?
