Over two days last week, we had the pleasure of being visited by the RAC who have worked with each of our Pre-Primary to Year 6 classes to share safe practices on and around the roads.


When crossing the road we know to stop, look, listen and think.

#### **Parent Surveys:**

Thank you to the many parents who contributed to the parent survey at the end of last year and start of this year. We had a huge response with 45 parent submissions adding to our school directions and the development of our new Business Plan. We will add further feedback from the P&C and Board shortly to ensure we have an extensive array of your ideas to bring to life. Most of the responses received were centred around upgrades to the school learning environment which has been a huge focus of the last two years to significantly enhance and modernise the school environment to contemporary standards. We will of course ensure this is a continued focus for the upcoming Business Plan.

Parent Feedback Received:	Our Response:
The gazebos at the carnival are looking a bit dated. Any chance these could be updated with all the other many upgrades around the school?	Great idea! We have had this on our planned upgrade list for 2024. These have now been quoted and will be ordered shortly in preparation for future events. At the same time we will be commissioning the creation of new faction logos for future flags and to adorn the gazebos. These of course will be selected by the students this year something we are very excited about!
What's happening with the kindy outdoor area? I noticed lots of movement in the area.	We have been preparing for another upgrade to this space. Over the holiday break we will be installing new modern fencing and in the months ahead we will see new shade sails installed over this area. In the medium term we also hope to add new paving and seating to make a beautiful space for students, staff and families to enjoy.
So many upgrades have been completed since you have been Principal but why wasn't works completed in past years before your arrival? How do you fit this into the day? You are always doing things around the school for our kids.	I appreciate your kind words and question. It's difficult to say but I suspect that every Principal has a focus on different things and prioritises things based on what they think their community needs most. For me, the learning environment of the school is just as important as cultivating sustainable relationships, having strong communication and building both academic and wellbeing success – all of which are something that I'm proud to put my time and effort towards as we create the school our community deserves. Much more is to come.
Better walking paths and upgrades to the girls toilets.	Upgrades to the girls toilets have been added to our upgrade schedule and will hopefully be upgraded over the next 1.5 years. Walking paths are being upgraded over time and something we will look at going forward.
Is the school getting new signage to compliment the other upgrades around the school?	Absolutely, I have been meeting with sign makers to review the cost of such an upgrade at GPS. A proposal is expected to be sent to me over the Easter break. Creating signage which makes it easier to navigate the school is a priority and will see the gates labelled with gate numbers, directional signage for key buildings and labels for our main buildings. We will also be adding school signs to the corners of Hicks and Clara and May and Hicks Street to make it easy to identify our school.

Parent Feedback Received:	Our Response:
I love the new kindy desks. Are new desks also being purchased for other year levels?	Thank you, we love them too! We have initiated a staged purchase of school furniture with new furniture (featuring coloured piping, legs and whiteboard style tops) adding vibrancy to rooms whilst also being height adjustable for greater amenity. To coincide with this, new coloured chairs to match the desk colours will be purchased. For 2024, new desks will be added for our 3 Pre-Primary classes with Year 1/2 classes expected to be upgraded in early 2025.
Let students wait in muster area from 8am which is before the 1st bell of 8:15. This used to be the practice pre-covid. This will prevent a build up of students waiting just outside the gate and will free car parking spots on the area.	This will be offered in the winter months or any day in which it is raining. Unfortunately, because students are being dropped off earlier and earlier and picked up later and later, we are unable to extend this time further for other periods of the week. As school starts for lessons at 8:30am, the opening of gates at 8:15am is a courtesy.  We strongly encourage parents who need to drop
	off earlier or pick up later to engage with before and or after school care options. Many parents already do this and it ensures the students are not waiting around unnecessarily for extended periods.
The school is more academical and disciplined these days.	We are proud to have a school where behaviour data overall shows that we are one of the best behaved and performing south metro schools (despite the challenges we face). A consistent, caring, fair and proactive approach has been key to our success in this area.
	Academic data is also showing that students are making significant gains whilst at GPS, something we expect to grow further as the many changes we are making and interventions and support we are providing is directly impacting student success, wellbeing and engagement.
